Dear Principals and PAF Coordinators

The purpose of this communication is to, firstly, thank you for your significant support for the Catholic Arts during 2024 and secondly, to provide the 2025 Updates of the Performing Arts Festival for your information.

In 2025, we celebrate the 36th year of the Performing Arts Festival. The Festival commences with an Opening Mass which will be held at St Mary's Cathedral on Thursday, 24 July. All sections of the Performing Arts Festival take place from 25 July through until 5 September.

Principals will receive this memo, the 2025 Performing Arts Festival poster and calendar via bulk mail. All School PAF Coordinators will receive all information digitally.

The Angelico Art Exhibition takes place from 11-29 August. Further information on the exhibition will be provided soon.

PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL

- Live Performances and Recorded Entries will again be offered in 2025.
- Recorded Entries will be viewed by Adjudicators and feedback provided. Due to schools' capacity to record and the nature of recordings, these will not be eligible for Shields, however Awards may be presented based upon Adjudicator recommendations. Reduced entry fees apply. Adjudication takes place Tuesday 30 September – Friday 3 October (during Term 3 school holidays). Feedback will be provided early Term 4.
- Venue Admission is determined by the capacity and the regulations that apply at the venue.
- The Final Concert takes place at Newman College on Tuesday 16 September.
- 90% communication from the Catholic Arts Office is via emails and the website
 with fewer bulk school mail outs. Please check the website regularly for any
 updates on the Festival or contact the office if unsure, so you are kept up to date.

With, in excess of 20,000 students involved from 162 Catholic schools from across Western Australia, the overall coordination of the Festival is an onerous task which continues to grow in complexity. To assist the staff at the Catholic Arts Office, the Performing Arts Festival Committee has reviewed practices over the past few years and compiled the following information to assist both schools and the office in ensuring efficient operation and participation for all. **Please read the information** carefully and contact the Catholic Arts Office catholicarts@cewa.edu.au should you require any clarification.

Again, we thank you for your support during the 2024 Festival and look forward to continuing the Catholic Arts journey with you and your school community in 2025.

PLEASE REVIEW THE RULES FOR EVERY ENTRY YOU ARE ENTERING

CERTIFICATES AWARDED

The marking criteria for Adjudicators is used as a guide only. Adjudicators are briefed on the criteria. Awards are not determined by the location or number of ticks received on an adjudication report. The Awards are at the adjudicator's discretion. Some Adjudicators award freely whilst others do not. The Office cannot overturn an Adjudicator's decision.

Adjudication Criteria on the reports have been amended. Please see 'Appendix 1_Criteria for Awards' on the website for more information. There will be no more 'Participation Certificates'. All participants will receive a Merit certificate except for those performers who have received an Outstanding or Excellence Certificate.

SECTION NAMES REPLACING ITEM CODES – Names Only

Item Codes have been deleted. All Sections will now be known by the actual name of the section. This information has been updated to the Online Entry portal, Rules, Info Memos and all documents published by Catholic Arts. (PAF Coordinators, see attached pdf list of all the sections by name.)

VOCAL SINGING – USE OF BACKING TRACKS

This year, the use of backing tracks will be permitted for the Vocal Section - <u>Instrumental backing only</u>. As this is a popular section with many participants, session times may possibly run longer each day.

<u>A reminder that students are to bring their own backing</u>. For reliability on reproduction of sound – all students <u>must</u> bring their own mobile device & speakers – Ready to Play (preferably Bluetooth/wireless) No CDs. If using a mobile phone, please bring your own aux. cord and adaptor applicable for your phone.

ONLINE ENTRIES ARE NOW OPEN

Entries to the Festival are available via the Catholic Arts Website **www.spiritofthearts.com.au**. 'Instructions on How to enter online' are included on the Online portal. Please contact the Catholic Arts Office staff if you have any questions. As a PAF Coordinator, your login details remain unchanged. All new coordinators will receive a 'Welcome Email' with instructions.

MUSIC AND STAGE PLANS CAN NOW BE UPLOADED WITH YOUR ONLINE ENTRY (Please note this is not yet functional and is a work in progress, PAF Coordinators will be advised shortly when this is completed)

Please remember to still write on the first page of the music sheet only:

- Performer's Name
- School
- Section Name

If music/stage plans are not submitted by the due date, the item will be ineligible for an Outstanding Award, Excellence Award or Perpetual Shield.





LIVE PERFORMANCES

CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES FOR LIVE PERFORMANCES: SUNDAY 11 MAY 2025

N.B. Please ensure there are no entries sitting "In Progress" on your Home Screen after closing date.

It is advisable to log in early, so you are aware that your access is working correctly. Don't leave entering online to the last minute as late entries will not be accepted.

RECORDED ENTRIES

If you wish to submit an item via electronic recording, please enter your item on the online portal and select 'Recorded' – Please ensure this is ticked otherwise the item will be timetabled as a live performance. Recordings are uploaded via streaming (a much more efficient process). Tips on how to submit recorded entries will be provided to schools. Adjudication feedback will be provided along with awards (if nominated by the Adjudicator). Shields are not awarded.

CLOSING DATE OF REGISTERING RECORDED ENTRIES: SUNDAY 11 MAY 2025

Please register your entry by this date. The office will not accept any late entries.

CLOSING DATE FOR UPLOADING THE URL FOR RECORDED ENTRIES: THURS 31 JULY 2025

Please upload your recorded entries to Microsoft Stream prior to this date and provide the URL on the online entry. The office will not accept any late submissions.

ADJUDICATION OF RECORDED ENTRIES

Adjudication of recorded entries takes place between 30 Sep – Fri 3 Oct with feedback provided to schools in Term 4.

MUSIC FOR RECORDED ENTRIES – DUE FRIDAY 23 MAY 2025, these can be uploaded on the entry form. (Stage plans are not required for recordings)

A reminder that students are to bring their own backing. For reliability on reproduction of sound – all students <u>must</u> bring their own mobile device & speakers – Ready to Play (preferably Bluetooth/wireless) No CDs. If using a mobile phone, please bring your own aux. cord and adaptor applicable for your phone.





ENTRY TO VENUES – VIA TRY BOOKING ONLINE TICKETING – NO DOOR SALES

Seating availability is dependent upon venue capacity and in accordance with the number indicated as 'Seats to Reserve' on entry form for group sections.

On the website, patrons will be able to click on the specific event/date/session they wish to attend and register with payment online. Patrons will not be permitted to select seating. Patrons will receive a confirmation and a bar code. This bar code is to be made available on your mobile phone to allow entry to the venue.

Tickets on sale Friday 4 July (with the exception of the Dance Section). As PAF Coordinator of your school, the office will send a reminder when tickets are open for sale. Please advertise this to your school community and advise parents to **book early** to avoid disappointment of missing out on seating. Seating capacity is dependent upon the venue, tickets will be sold on a first come basis until the maximum limit has been reached.

If there are any restrictions in place during Festival events, the audience will need to vacate the venue in between sessions and/or interval for evening performances – to allow the next group in.

Entry to venues will not be permitted without the purchased ticket.

Once Timetables are complete, changes cannot be made as this affects ticket sales within try booking.

FIRST NATIONS CONTENT

If you are entering items which contain First Nations story, art, music or content, please ensure that cultural sensitivity is observed. You will also need to ensure that the correct permissions have been approved. This can be done through consulting with local First Nations community or by contacting the First Nations team member in the relevant CEWA office.

CONFLICTING DATES WITH SCHOOL CALENDARS

Please ensure that you have <u>double checked</u> your School's calendar so that Performance dates do not clash with PD days, Catholic Days, Pupil Free Days, Excursions, Camps, Sports Days etc. Once the timetabling is complete, the office <u>will not</u> be able to swap dates of performances. We ask for due consideration when entering your performances.

SPECIAL REQUESTS

Special Requests are taken into consideration only in extenuating circumstances and in accordance with reasons stated in Appendix 4B (see website for further details), however, not all requests can be accommodated.

TIMETABLING

The Festival Committee has ruled that schools may not request changes to timetables and emphasises the need for schools to adhere to the allocated performance dates and times. The office will not be able to swap dates of performances once timetabling has been completed. Timetable changes also affect Try Booking ticketing. Schools will receive their timetable package in June.

PRINCIPAL'S RESPONSIBILITY

Please ensure that your Principal has checked that items are appropriate and suitable in content of song, choreography and costume choices as this is their responsibility (e.g. no drug references, inappropriate language or dress, suicidal or sexual connotations.)

N.B. The Principal or their nominated representative must check the list of entries and tick the box on the online entry <u>acknowledging</u> the school's acceptance of the Festival Rules & Procedures.





PRIVACY INFORMATION FOR PARENTS & STUDENTS

Please refer to the Privacy Information Sheet for Group Performers and Solo/Duet Performers on the website. This important information must be distributed to all parents/guardians of Festival participants paying particular attention to videoing and photographs for publicity purposes. This form will also be included in the timetable package sent in June.

AUDIENCE VIDEO RECORDINGS OF FESTIVAL PERFORMANCES

The general public may video or photograph a Festival performance depending on Venue considerations, however, <u>uploading any images to social media is strictly prohibited</u>. Flash photography is not allowed as this distracts performers. Certain privacy restraints relating to entrants or schools may be in place, whereby videoing or photographing of those performances will not be allowed. The audience will be advised of these by the MC at the commencement of each section. <u>Filming at the Dance section at PCEC is not permitted</u>.
